that I might ²fully carry out *the preaching of* the word of God, ²⁶ *that is*, ^athe mystery which had been hidden from the *past* ages and generations, but now has been revealed to His ¹saints, ²⁷ to whom ^aGod willed to make known what ^bthe wealth of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles is, *the mystery* that is ^cChrist in you, the ^dhope of glory. ²⁸ We proclaim Him, ^aadmonishing every person and teaching every person ¹with all ^bwisdom, so that we may ^cpresent every person ^{2d}complete in Christ. ²⁹ For this purpose I also ^alabor, ^bstriving ^caccording to His ¹power which ²works mightily within me.

Chapter 2

You Are Built Up in Christ

¹For I want you to know how great a ¹struggle I have in your behalf and for those who are at ¹bLaodicea, and for all those who have not ¹personally seen my face, ² that their ²hearts may be encouraged, having been ¹bknit together in love, and that they would attain to all ¹the wealth ¹that comes from the full assurance of understanding, resulting in a ¹true knowledge of God's mystery, that is, Christ Himself, ³ in whom are hidden all ²the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. ⁴ ²I say this so that no one will deceive you with ¹bpersuasive arguments. ⁵ For even though I am ²absent in

body, I am nevertheless with you in spirit, rejoicing ¹to see ²your borderly manner and the cstability of your faith in Christ.

⁶Therefore, as you have received ^aChrist Jesus the Lord, *so* ^{1b}walk in Him, ⁷ having been firmly ^arooted and *now* being ^bbuilt up in Him and ^cestablished ¹in ²your faith, just as you ^dwere instructed, *and* overflowing ³with gratitude.

⁸ ^aSee to it that there is no one who takes you captive through bphilosophy and empty deception in accordance with human tradition, in accordance with the elementary principles of the world, 1 rather than in accordance with Christ. 9 For in Him all the afullness of Deity dwells in bodily form, 10 and in Him you have been amade complete, and bHe is the head over every cruler and authority; 11 and in Him ayou were also - circumcised with a circumcision performed without hands, in the removal of bthe body of the flesh by the circumcision of Christ, 12 having been aburied with Him in baptism, in which you were also ^braised with Him through faith in the working of God, who craised Him from the dead. 13 And 1when you were adead 2in your wrongdoings and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He bmade you alive together with Him, having forgiven us all our wrongdoings, 14 having canceled athe certificate of debt consisting of decrees against us, which was hostile to us; and bHe has taken it out of the way, having

nailed it to the cross. ¹⁵ When He had ^{1a} disarmed the ^brulers and authorities, He ^amade a public display *of them*, having ^ctriumphed over them through ²Him.

Therefore, no one is to ¹aact as your judge in regard to bfood and bdrink, or in respect to a cfestival or a dnew moon, or a eSabbath ²day—¹7 things which are anlu a ashadow of what is to come; but the ¹substance ²belongs to Christ. ¹8 Take care that no one keeps ¹adefrauding you of your prize by bdelighting in humility and the worship of the angels, ²taking his stand on visions he has seen, ³cinflated without cause by his dfleshly mind, ¹9 and not holding firmly to athe head, from whom bthe entire body, being supplied and held together by the joints and ¹ligaments, grows with a growth ²which is from God.

Chapter 3

Put On the New Self

¹Therefore, if you have been ^araised with Christ, keep seeking the things *that are* above, where Christ is, ^bseated at the right hand of God. ² ^{1a}Set your minds on the things *that are* above, not on the things that are on earth. ³ For you have ^adied, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ, ^awho is our life, is revealed, ^bthen you also will be revealed with Him in glory.

body as dead to ^csexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which ²amounts to idolatry. ⁶ For it is because of these things that ^athe wrath of God is coming ¹upon the ²sons of disobedience, ⁷ and ^ain them you also once walked, when you were living ¹in them. ⁸ But now you also, ^arid yourselves of all of them: ^banger, wrath, malice, slander, and ^cobscene speech from your mouth. ⁹ ^{1a}Do not lie to one another, since you ^bstripped off the old ²self with its *evil* practices, ¹⁰ and have ^aput on the new *self*,

which is being ^{1b}renewed to a true knowledge ^caccording to the image of the One who ^dcreated it—¹¹ a renewal in which ^athere is no <u>distinction</u> <u>between</u> Greek and Jew, ^bcircumcised and uncircumcised, ^{1c}barbarian, ²Scythian, ^dslave, and free, but ^eChrist is all, and in all.

¹² So, as those who have been ^achosen of God, holy and beloved, bput on a cheart of compassion, kindness, dhumility, gentleness, and 1epatience; 13 abearing with one another, and bforgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; bjust as the Lord forgave you, so must you do also. 14 In addition to all these things put on love, which is ^{1a}the perfect bond of ^bunity. 15 Let athe peace of Christ, to which you were ¹indeed called in ^bone body, ²rule in your hearts; and 3be thankful. 16 Let athe word of 1Christ richly dwell within you, ²with all wisdom bteaching and admonishing 3one another cwith psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, dsinging with thankfulness in your hearts to God. 17 Whatever you do in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, bgiving thanks through Him to God the Father.

Chapter 4

¹Masters, grant your slaves justice and fairness, ^aknowing that you also have a Master in heaven.

Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with *an attitude of* thanksgiving; ³ praying at the same time ^afor us as well, that God will open up to us a ^bdoor for ^cthe word, so that we may proclaim ^dthe mystery of Christ, for which I have also ^ebeen imprisoned; ⁴ that I may make it clear ^ain the way that I ought to proclaim *it*.

To Philemon our beloved *brother* and ^efellow worker, ² and to Apphia ^{1a}our sister, and to ^bArchippus our ^cfellow soldier, and to ^dthe church in your house: ³ ^aGrace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Philemon's Love and Faith

4 aI thank my God always, making mention of you in my prayers, 5 because I ahear of your love and of the faith which you have toward the Lord Jesus and toward all the asaints; 6 and I pray that the fellowship of your faith may become effective through the aknowledge of every good thing which is in you for the sake of Christ. 7 For I have had great ajoy and comfort in your love, because the hearts of the saints have been brefreshed through you, brother.

Plea for Onesimus, a Free Man

¹⁰ I ^aappeal to you for my ^{b1}son ^{2c}Onesimus, whom I 3fathered in my 4imprisonment, 11 who previously was useless to you, but now is useful both to you and to me. 12 I have sent him back to you in person, that is, sending my very heart, 13 whom I wanted to keep with me, so that in your behalf he might be at my service in my 12 imprisonment for the gospel; 14 but I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that your goodness would anot be, in effect, by compulsion, but of your own free will. 15 For perhaps it was afor this reason that he was separated from you for a while, that you would have him back forever, ¹⁶ ano longer as a slave, but more than a slave, ba beloved brother, especially to me, but how much more to you, both cin the flesh and in the Lord.

¹⁷ If then you regard me *as* a ^apartner, accept him as *you would* me. ¹⁸ But if he has wronged you in any way or owes *you anything*, charge that to my account; ¹⁹ ^aI, Paul, have written *this* with my own hand, I will repay *it* (^bnot to ¹mention to you that you owe to me even your own self as well). ²⁰ Yes, brother, let me benefit from you in the Lord; ^arefresh my heart in Christ.
